

RE: Billing Inpatient COVID-19 Consultations for Patients in Isolation

Dear Provider:

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana is keeping a close eye on the many needs of our providers including how best to report novel coronavirus (COVID-19) services. As more people are diagnosed with COVID-19, some may require isolated inpatient hospitalization.

Please follow these guidelines for billing inpatient consultations when the provider is not able to physically enter the room of a patient in isolation:

- continue using the standard hospital-based codes (CPT[®] codes 99251-99255) for new and established patients
- report Modifier CR for these services

For these patients, Blue Cross is waiving the requirement for a physical exam and the provider should fully document the scope of their services—including why a physical exam could not be performed—in the patient's medical record. Claims will be processed the same as consultations where the patient is able to be physically examined.

Blue Cross will continue to notify providers of billing guidelines as new developments occur. Thank you for working with us to serve our members, especially during this time of uncertainty. Please continue to communicate with Blue Cross as your needs change to meet the COVID-19 crisis. We value you as a key part of our provider networks and the services you bring to our members—your patients.
